Learning Objectives:

- 1) Participants will formulate an understanding of decolonization and identify how to use this process in examining their CESP systems. They will analyze Critical Race Theory in Education and evaluate how to address educational inequities and use this framework for determining changes needed in their CESP.
- 2) Participants will be able to demonstrate the differences between culturally inclusive and antiracist practices in their CESP. They will be able to recognize the personalities of their CESP stakeholders and to address this impact for future development programming.
- 3) Participants will describe and contrast different approaches to diversify their CEP pedagogical methodologies and formulate how these approaches can be used with each system of CESPs. Approaches include ways to revolutionize pedagogy, change practices, re-examine program expectations, decolonize curricula, and expand methodologies.
